- 4 While applicants may state their preferences for specific courses listed on the Department's job posting, the Department reserves the right to assign TAs to whatever courses it feels best suit the candidate's qualifications and departmental needs. TAs will only be assigned to courses in fields in which they are or should be qualified to assist.
